We are happy to provide templates and support, to enable you to show off your plot, your passion and skills to other volunteers.

Whether you are new to the scheme or have been with us since the start, share your experience with conservation managers, policy experts, and charity leads!

Submit your poster by 30th September.

Poster Guidance:

Content: Whether you'd like to share how your square has changed over time or a particular highlight, just make it personal to your own experience and be sure to include images.

Template and size: All posters should be A1, Portrait format (59.4 cm wide x 84.1 cm tall). Text should be at least 24pt, using simple fonts like Arial, Helvetica, or Verdana.

File type: For best printing results, save your poster as either a PDF or Jpeg file.

Email your Jpeg or let us know you're bringing your poster by 30th September



Plant Walk – Leading a local guided walk in a nature reserve or on an existing plot, especially exciting if the plot includes rare or easily identifiable plants.

Setting up a Square – Reaching out to local community groups (gardening groups, community groups, walking groups) and offering to walk them through setting up a locally available survey square could be a brilliant introduction to the scheme.

Nature Reserve visit – Why not pay a visit to a local nature reserve and take along friends and family to highlight local plant life and the benefits of engaging in biodiversity monitoring and conservation. As well as a lovely day out, this could be a great chance to talk about your own monitoring experience and what the NPMS looks to achieve.

NPMS Talks – Arranging a talk to a community or interest group about the scheme and the achievements of volunteers could be a great draw for anyone interested in plants or nature conservation. This could either be given by you locally, or we are more than happy to provide an online talk.

Perhaps you're a member of a community group with survey squares available near you?

We have also created a 10th anniversary logo, which can be downloaded from our resources and included on any communications about the scheme.
